Cultural District

Located between the Convention Center and Stanwix Street in the heart of Downtown Pittsburgh, the 14-square block Cultural District encompasses over 90 retail shops, 50 dining establishments, seven world-class theaters, eight public parks and art installations and a dozen art galleries. Grant Street Corridor

The Grant Street Corridor is the center for commerce and industry in Downtown. It runs for 11 blocks between Fort Pitt Boulevard and Liberty Avenue and it boasts some of the oldest surviving buildings in the city such as the Allegheny County Courthouse (1884) and First Lutheran Church (1887). The U.S. Steel Building, which is Pittsburgh's tallest building at 62 stories, resides along Grant Street. Market Square is a social and cultural hub located in Downtown Pittsburgh at the intersection of Forbes Avenue and Market Street. North Shore

Along the Allegheny and Ohio Rivers, the North Shore boasts great views of Downtown right along its River Walk. Most famous for its iconic sports venues on the North Shore – Heinz Field and PNC Park – it also offers world-class museums, artwork, monuments, and memorials that honor the people, events, and industries in the region. The North Shore is home to the Rivers Casino, The Andy Warhol Museum, Fred Rogers tribute, multiple War Memorials, and the Carnegie Science Center, to name a few.
